

Prof. Mooli Lahad Ph.D. has 2 PhDs one in Psychology and the other in Human and Life Science.

Senior medical and education psychologist , professor of dramatherapy and psychology at Tel Hai College in the Upper Galilee in Israel and at Roehampton University, in England. He is the president of the Community Stress Prevention Center (CSPC), an NGO which he founded 30 years ago. The center has over 100 professional staff members and gave over 180,000 hours of training and over 19000 hours of treatment to patients over these years.

One of the world leading experts on community and public behavior and coping with disasters . Serving as a consultant to the Israeli National Security Council, and to the following ministries on preparedness ,management and coping with disasters and their aftermath. Following the WTC terrorist attack on America he trained both in NY and NJ community workers, first responders, mental health staff and medical care teams. He was the director of international initiative to help Sri Lanka following the Tsunami and developed and administered a local training the trainers' program for community, education and health sectors from 2005-2007.

Abroad he served for many years as a consultant to UNICEF during and after the Yugoslavia war, and to the Turkish government after the 1999 earthquake, Prof Lahad former member of the NATO committee on psychosocial preparedness to disasters.

Professor Lahad is the author and co author of 27 books and many articles on the topics of Communities under Stress, Community unrest, Coping with Life Threatening Situations, the use of Creative therapies in post trauma and grief .

Prof Lahad is the recipient of three professional Prizes: The Israeli Psychology Association - Bonner Prize for outstanding contributions to Education in Israel, The Adler Institute for the welfare of the child Prize Tel Aviv University, and the Israeli Lottery Prize for innovations in medicine for developing a telepsychology services.
